Overview

The Architectural Historian is responsible for demonstrating expertise in Section 106 consultation, historic resources surveys, and the development of historic contexts. The position will work on a wide range of projects in the government and private sector and support departments across the organization.

Principal Duties and Responsibilities

- Provide National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) eligibility evaluations.
- Assess potential effects to historic properties.
- Conduct intensive-level historic resources surveys nationwide.
- Prepare architectural descriptions, survey/inventory forms and technical reports.
- Prepare Cultural Resource Reports for Section 106 consultation.
- Assist in the preparation of NRHP nominations and development of historic contexts.
- Conduct archival research at local repositories including libraries, archives, museums, and land record offices, among others.

Required Qualifications

- Must meet the Secretary of Interior's Historic Preservation Qualification Standards in History, Historic Architecture and/or Architectural History.
- MA/MS in Historic Preservation Planning, History, or similar field of study.
- Minimum of 2 years of experience in a related position.
- Demonstrated experience in conducting research for historic properties.
- Demonstrated experience in conducting historic resource surveys and writing architectural descriptions.
- Experience in preparing NRHP eligibility assessments and nominations.
- Strong written and verbal communication is essential. The candidate must be willing to provide samples of work demonstrating writing ability, historic context development, and knowledge of American Architectural History.
- Demonstrated experience evaluating potential effects to historic properties, particularly those with an emphasis on visual impacts.

Preferred Qualifications

- Working knowledge of GIS technology.
- Working knowledge of AutoCad and PhotoShop.
- Experience in preparing Rehabilitation Tax Credit Applications.
- Experience in developing Historic Preservation Plans and Design Guidelines.
- Experience with community involvement including local governments, community and religious leaders, and residents.

Physical/Environmental Requirements

- Prolonged periods of sitting at a desk and working on a computer.
- Ability to work in a variety of weather conditions in outdoor environments for extended periods of time.
- Ability to travel, oftentimes out of state for multiple days at a time
